- School Security and Safety



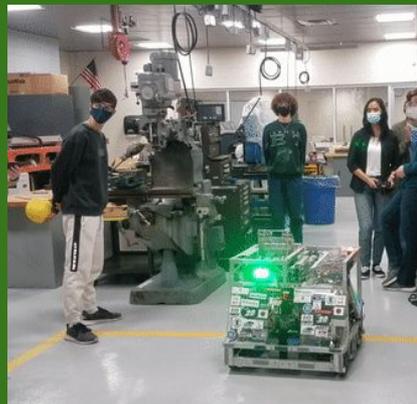
# Rules for Use of SSBA Funds

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## Early Learning Center Project Costs

Building network & PA wiring - materials & installation	
Installation of all Emergency Notification Boards	
Installation of all Wireless Access Points	\$629,000
Two Large Group Instruction Spaces - equipment & installation	
Office and Classroom Phones	\$54,862
Emergency Notification Boards & Analog Speakers	\$117,971
<b>Total</b>	<b>\$801,833</b>

# Project Timeline

## Step 1

### Priorities Set

Administration consults current Shen plans that are state required, like the District Technology Plan to establish possible priorities in the approved categories.

## Step 2

### Committee Review

Smart School Planning Committee reviews the proposal and makes recommendation to the Board of Education.

Student(s), Staff, Administrators, BOE member, Parent(s), Community member(s)

## Step 3

### BOE Review

With the Committee's consent, proposal submitted to the BOE as a preliminary plan. BOE reviews the committee recommendations and possibly accepts the preliminary plan.

## Step 4

### Post Plan on Web

Smart Bond Investment Preliminary Plan is published on the school district web site with an email address for public comments for a minimum of 30 days.

# Project Timeline

## Step 5

### Comments Reviewed

After 30 days the Smart Bond Investment Plan comments are reviewed by the Board of Education.

## Step 6

### BOE's Decision

Board of Education possibly approves final plan for submission to NYSED.

## Step 7

### Submit Plan to NYS

Final NYSED review could be six to 12 months.
